Housekeeping Standards Continues:



6. Food storage areas should be neat and clean without spilled food.

7. Trash/garbage will be stored in a covered container until removed to the disposal area.

Bathroom:

- Toilet and tank should be clean and odor-free.
- 2. Tub and shower should be clean and free of excessive mold and mildew. Where applicable, the shower curtain will be in place and of adequate length.
- 3. Lavatory closet should be neat and clean.
- 4. Exhaust fan should be free of dust
- 5. Floor should be clean and dry.

Storage Areas:

- 1. Linen closet should be neat and clean
- 2. Other closets will be neat and clean. No highly flammable materials will be stored in the unit.
- 3. Other storage areas should be clean, neat, and free of hazards.

Housekeeping Standards: Outside of the Unit

The following will apply to family and scattered sit developments only, some standards apply only when the area noted is for the exclusive use of the Tenant:

- 1. Yards will be free of debris, trash, and abandoned cars. Exterior walls should be free of graffiti.
- 2. Porches (front and rear) will be clean and free of hazards. Any items stored on the porch shall not impede access to the unit.
- 3. Steps (front and rear) will be clean and free of hazards.
- 4. Sidewalks will be clean and free of hazards.
- 5. Storm doors will be clean, with glass or screens intact.
- 6. Parking lots should be free of abandoned cars. There should be no car repairs in the lots.
- 7. Stairwells will be clean and uncluttered.

Who receives a Housekeeping inspection? If management or maintenance enter the unit and the unit is dirty this will be reported to the office or if Pest Controls enter your unit and it's reported that the unit is dirty the tenant is subject to housekeeping inspections.

Lease Violations for Housekeeping: If a Tenant's unit is inspected for the 1st time and fails, the Tenant will be scheduled for a re-inspection. If the unit passes no further action is taken. If, the second reinspect fails a housekeeping class will be mandatory. After completion of the housekeeping class, the tenant will be scheduled a weekly inspection for 1 month. These inspections will be determined and set at the housekeeping class. These inspections will last for one month. If during the weekly inspections, a unit fails: the tenant will receive a 30-day eviction. The Resident Coordinator will discuss the actual start date with you at the housekeeping class. After one month of inspections, you will be on a one-year probationary period. No further reports of unsanitary living conditions will be accepted and the Housing Manager will issue a thirty (30) day eviction order.





MANAGER'S CORNER

Housekeeping Standards: Inside the Unit

Walls should be clean of dirt, grease holes, cobwebs, and fingerprints. 1. 2. Floors should be clean, dry, and free of hazards. Ceiling should be clean and free of cobwebs. 3. Windows should be clean, not nailed shut, and white shades or blinds intact. 4. 5. Woodwork should be clean, and free of dust, gorges, or scratches. Doors should be clean, free of grease and fingerprints, with functional locks. 6. Heating units should be dusted and access uncluttered. 7. Trash should be disposed of properly and not left on the unit. 8. Entire unit should be free of rodent and insects infestation. 9. Pictures or other articles may be attached to the walls as long as they can be removed 10. without damage, outside ordinary wear and tear. Tick-on type hangers are not allowed. The recommended nail size is 4, to prevent large holes in walls.

Kitchen:

- Stove should be clean and free of food and grease.
- 2. Refrigerator should be clean and neat. Freezer door should close properly.
- 3. Cabinets should be clean and neat. Cabinet surface and counter top should be free of grease and spilled food. Cabinets will not be overloaded. Storage under the sink will be limited to small or lightweight items to permit access for repairs. Heavy pots and pans will not be stored directly under the sink.
- 4. Exhaust fan should be free of grease and dust.
- 5. Sink should be clean free of grease and garbage. Dirty dishes will be washed and put away in a timely manner.
