## Affordable Housing for Disabled Families!

**AHA** was awarded **195** vouchers to administer the Mainstream Voucher Program (MVP). The purpose of the program is to provide non-elderly, low-income families with a disabled — family member (age 18-61), the opportunity to live in affordable housing of their choice.

### A Wait List Preference is Provided to Families with a Disabled Family Member Who Are:

- Transitioning out of institutional or segregated settings;
- At serious risk of institutionalization;
- Homeless; or
- At risk of becoming homeless

If needed or wanted, by participants (although not required), the program offers supportive services provided by some of our partner organizations.
